Matt. 28:19-20; John 15:12-17; Acts 1:8

What Does It Mean To Go?

- **Matthew's Great Commission**

- “_____ and _____ all nations.” Matthew does not use the word “evangelize.” *The word he used has the connotation of instruction or teaching, with the aim of conversion.*
 - *It is “make disciple” – not find, attract or draw those who are already disciples. **Matthew teaches a philosophy of attachment, not attraction.***
- This is Matthew’s emphasis – *instruction with the aim of _____.*

- **Mark's Great Commission**

- “Go ye into all the world, and preach the gospel to every _____” (**Mark 16:15**).
 - He uses the term euaggelion, from which we get our English words “evangelism” and “gospel” or good news.
 - *He references “the world,” but does not forget the _____.* Our vision also is to see every human being have the opportunity to hear and understand the Gospel of Christ.

- **Luke's Great Commission**

- The context of Dr. Luke’s Commission is Jesus rehearsing the facts of the Gospel with the eleven (**Luke 24:46-48**), then commanding the preaching of repentance and remission of sins “among all nations beginning at Jerusalem.” Again, the international, missionary component is present.
- *Luke emphasizes the _____ witnessing dimension of the Great Commission*

- **John's Great Commission**

- He used the word apostello (meaning “one sent on a mission”) when He said, “As [my] Father hath _____ me, even so _____ I you” (**John 20:21**).
 - In John’s account, Jesus’ emphasis is on our _____ to Him.
- The Acts account, written by Luke also, is the only one of the five accounts with a specific methodology given. The strategy is to begin at home and proceed in concentric circles until we have gone to the uttermost parts of the globe.

- **Picture of Evangelism**

- We are “sent” people on a specific mission. The scope of the mission is international – to all nations. Our target group is every creature.

- **Philosophy of Evangelism**

- In one brief verse, we have the philosophy of evangelism of the first New Testament church: “*And daily in the temple, and in every house, they ceased not to teach and preach Jesus Christ*” (**Acts 5:42**).

- **How Much Does God Love Us?**
 - “Yea, I have loved thee with an _____ love: therefore with lovingkindness have I drawn thee” (**Jeremiah 31:3; 29:11; John 3:16**)
- **Jesus gave the Greatest Example of God’s Love.**

- **Jesus _____ God’s Love.**
 - **Romans 5:8** – “But God commendeth (proved) his love towards us, in that, while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us.”
 - *God has provided an answer to our dilemma with sin.* There is a litmus test
 - “Let me name 3 – 4 of them and see how we do...”
 - ~ Thou shall not lie (**9th commandment**)
 - ~ Thou shall not steal (**8th commandment**)
 - ~ Do not take God’s name in vain (**3rd commandment**)
 - ~ Thou shall not have any other God’s before me (**1st commandment**)
 - “**Based on your own _____ you are a liar, thief, blasphemer, and idolater; so when you stand before God would be innocent or guilty of breaking God’s laws?**”
 - ~ How many of you would say, “guilty”, let’s turn to **Romans 3:19-20** and validate this truth with the Word of God.

Romans 3:19 – “Now we know that what things soever the law saith, it saith to them who are under the law: **that every mouth may be stopped, and all the world may become _____ before God.**”

Romans 3:20 – “Therefore by the deeds of the law there shall no flesh be justified in his sight: for by the law [is] the knowledge of sin.” Every single one of us has broken God’s laws and therefore we deserve justice. The Bible says, “But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and **idolaters**, and **all liars**, shall have their part in **the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death**” (**Revelations 21:8**). **He must deal with your sin, it must be punished.**
 - “So according to the Bible, if you were not a saved person, what would happen to you if you were to die?” **Hell!** “How does that would make you feel?” **Pretty bad; scared; not good; etc.**

Once a person realizes they are guilty sinners before God, and their punishment is an eternal hell, they are ready to be saved, because they need to be saved.

Would you be willing to allow Jesus Christ to do something for you that you cannot do for yourself?

The last part of **Romans 6:23** states, “but the gift of God [is] eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord.” Since the gift of eternal life is a gift and something we cannot earn or do for ourselves, then you must believe that Jesus Christ is the Son of God. You must:

- **Believe – John 3:15-16**
- **Repent – Luke 13:3, 5**
- **Call upon Jesus – Romans 10:9-10, 13**
